



## Read This First, Coach!

### Young, **New** Readers

Wait until your child is preschool-age to begin these alphabet games.

Start with 3-5 games. Play each game for about 3 minutes. Gradually add more letters until your child is playing for 10-15 minutes each day. Review automated letters and keep learning new letters.

### Older, **Struggling** Readers

As above, but build up this set of games to total **twenty** minutes of play every day. Remember, keep it fun.
